TITLE OF REFERRAL: GE-013-201: ENG 4110: Technologies of Writing (New Course)

BACKGROUND:

This is a new course in GE Area C3.

RESOURCES CONSULTED:

Office of Academic Programs.

DISCUSSION:

This course, Technologies of Writing, was designed by the English Department to analyze writing broadly defined to explore how materiality and the medium of communication affects writing processes and becomes interdependent forms of meaning. Students will demonstrate a cultural perspective on the development of different writing technologies, along with other humanities related themes. It is required that courses in this area shall emphasize the humanistic or expressive aspects of culture. Synthesis offerings should provide temporal and cultural context that will illuminate contemporary thought and behavior-global, regional, and local – showing the bonds between the past, present, and future. The expanded course outline for this course proposed clearly indicates an integration of themes and issues within Philosophy, Fine Arts, Language, Performing Arts, History and Literature. Using the C3 rubric, the GE committee determined that this is indeed an appropriate course proposal in the GE area and fully endorse it and is well designed with many meaningful written assignments, viable assessment matrices, and overall seems an important course for CPP students.
