The student will complete an approved 800 hours of Professional Work Experience (PWE) in a hospitality industry segment that allows the student to apply classroom knowledge with guided practice. The PWE position will offer a variety of tasks relevant to the student's career preparation, an opportunity for autonomy, an opportunity to interact with other employees, and an opportunity to engage in management and/or supervisory activities for the employer or host property.</p> <p>*** For the Food and Beverage Series, the lunch option will require students to take HRT 3830 - 01 and HRT 3830L -01 concurrently. The dinner option will require students to take HRT 3830 - 02 and HRT 3830L -02 concurrently.</p> <p>**** For the Lodging Series, students must complete a minimum 200 hours of hotel/lodging-specific PWE (may be part of overall PWE) prior to enrolling in HRT 3930 .</p>		<p>Any course taken in the Major Required may not be used to also satisfy an Elective.
