CSU Executive Order 1111

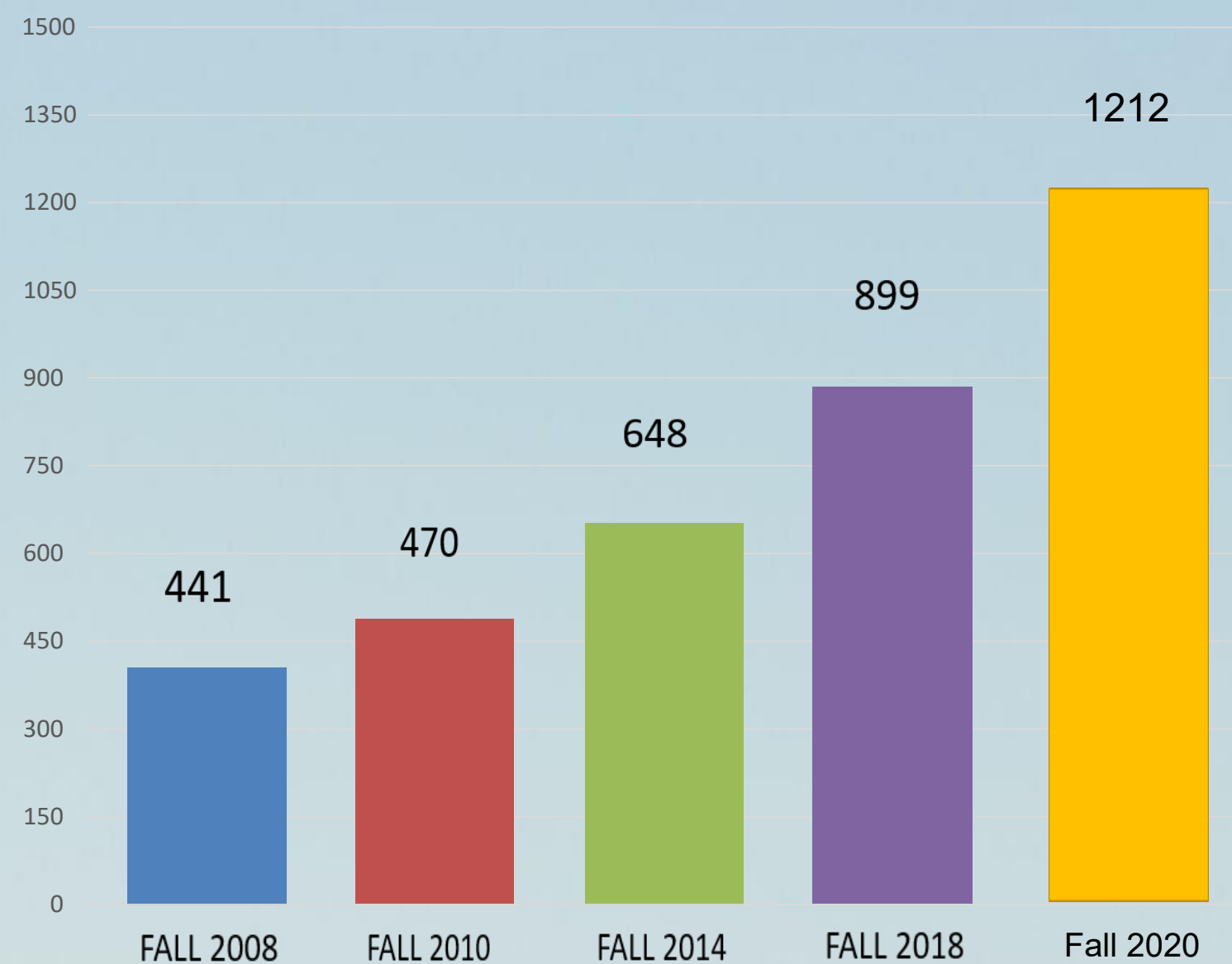

To create a culture of access for an inclusive learning and working environment.

STEPS OF INCLUSIVITY



- Follow **universal design standards** to create accessible programs and services for people with a variety of learning styles
- In your communications, **encourage** people to contact your department if they need an accommodation, have a question, or need clarification
- Provide **accessible multimedia and digital materials** (e.g. closed-captioned videos, OCR PDF documents, descriptions for social media images, etc.)
- Include pictures of individuals with and without disabilities **interacting** when designing or developing media
- Purchase accessible products that meet **Section 508 guidelines**
