Welcome from State Chair, Olukemi Sawyerr

Welcome to <u>ACE Women's Network of Southern California</u> (ACE WNSC) spring 2023 newsletter. My name is Olukemi Sawyerr. I am the state chair of the ACE WNSC. I am also a professor of strategy and entrepreneurship in the College of Business Administration, and I currently serve as the associate vice president for Academic Innovation at Cal Poly Pomona. ACE WNSC is part of a <u>national system of networks</u> with the goal of advancing and supporting women in higher education.

This has been an extremely exciting year for the Network:

- We provided high quality programming that was informed by our spring 2022 member needs assessment.
- Over 140 participants learned about allyship during our fall conference: *Women Empowering Women Through Allyship: Connect, Contribute and Collaborate* on October 21, 2022.
- Our February 2023 virtual event, funded by the inaugural ACE Women's Network mini grant, gathered 167 men and women from across California to uplift voices and build supportive relationships.
- Our first in-person Lunch and Learn event on April 21, 2023, allowed 140 participants to gain insights, develop connections, and listen to an inspirational panel of Cal State Long Beach women leaders: President, Jane Close Conoley, Provost and Senior Vice President of Academic Affairs, Karyn Scissum Gunn, and Vice President of Student Affairs, Beth Lesen.

This was the first year of a formalized structure for the Network. We approved our bylaws and strategic plan in summer 2022. The board was also actively engaged to ensure they were consistently serving our members' needs. We look forward to rolling out the strategic plan in the service of our members. We are also pleased to be on the verge of our institutional membership drive – where we will invite university presidents within the 10-county Southern California area to join and support our efforts to advance women in higher education.

We thank our Presidential Sponsor, Dr. Soraya M. Coley, for being a stalwart supporter of our Network. We could not accomplish all that we have without her consistent financial and moral support. We also acknowledge the commitment, dedication, and leadership of the Advisory Council of Institutional Representatives (IRs) and the Network Board of Directors, and the continued support of the national ACE Women's Network.

Life has a way of surprising us when we least expect it, presenting us with remarkable opportunities that test our courage and determination. Picture this: I was newly married, contemplating starting a family, when an extraordinary chance to become a department chair unfolded before me. Doubt gripped my heart as I weighed the responsibilities of the role against my family plans. It was in these moments of uncertainty that my mentors stepped in. Their encouragement helped me to seize the opportunity and embark on a new personal journey.

Embrace Ambition and Possibility: Sheryl Sandberg once said, "We hold ourselves back in ways both big and small, by lacking self-confidence, by not raising our hands, and by pulling back when we should be leaning in." Their unwavering belief in me provided the necessary strength and encouragement to navigate the challenges ahead. As Sandberg writes, "We are more effective and happier when surrounded by those who believe in us."

Embrace Vulnerability and Growth: Pregnancy brought with it physical and emotional changes that tested my resilience. There were times when I felt overwhelmed and doubted my ability to manage it all. In those moments, I reminded myself that vulnerability is not a weakness, but a sign of strength. Male Leaders as Allies: Bridging Gender Gaps in Higher Education Leadership

We are pleased to share a sneak peek into the research conducted by the ACE Women Networks of Northern and Southern California. Made possible through the ACE mini grant, the *Male Leaders as Allies in Women's Leadership* research report highlights the pivotal role of male allies to close higher education gender gaps.

As we strive to achieve our goal of gender equity in higher education, it is crucial to understand the dynamics of male allies in women's leadership. While women are instrumental in supporting one another, it is equally as important to involve male leaders to help mentor and sponsor women for leadership, considering their greater representation in these roles.

A phenomenological qualitative exploration, this research delves into the role of male leaders as allies, mentors, and sponsors of women. It also examines strategies to strengthen relationships with male allies and explores institutional plans, programs, and initiatives to support the advancement of women into leadership positions.

The research findings will offer valuable insights into the perspectives of male leaders regarding the obstacles to women's success and barriers to their representation. Additionally, the study will provide techniques for men to better support women in their pursuit of leadership opportunities, and present strategies and solutions to address gender gaps through the power of male allyship.

We invite you to review the full research report when it is soon published. The insights promise to enrich our understanding and create more inclusive and supportive environments for women aspiring to leadership roles in higher education.
