Cal Poly Pomona (CPP) Current Impaction Policy

	FTF	UDT
Academic Level (or Campus) Impaction A campus receives more eligible applicants at the first-time freshman or transfer student level than they can accommodate. Thus, the campus itself is then called “impacted.”	Yes	No
Program Impaction A campus looks at each of its programs' capacity, and the number of students currently enrolled and determines how many more students the program can accommodate. When a program continually gets more eligible applicants than it can accommodate, the campus will ask for the program to be called "impacted."	Yes	Yes
Full Impaction A campus that is fully impacted on <i>all</i> levels and for <i>all</i> majors. Each individual program at a campus must then determine its capacity and how many new students it can accept. Examples of Fully Impacted campuses include Fullerton, SLO, and SDSU.	No	No

Impaction Proposal Overview for 2027-28

First-Time Freshmen

- Discontinue Freshmen Level Impaction
- Impact Business Administration – Finance, Real Estate, and Law (freshmen level only)

Upper Division Transfer

- Modify supplemental pre-requisites for Computer Science
 - ✓ Modify 2 of 3 supplemental pre-requisites from required to recommended



Proposal 1: Discontinue Freshmen Level Impaction

Local Area will be the State of California

- All applicants to non-impacted majors will be admitted if they meet the CSU minimum admission requirements.
 - ✓ High School Graduate or GED
 - ✓ A-G coursework completed with grades of at least a C-
 - ✓ 2.5 GPA for California residents and 3.00 for non-California residents

Maintain Program Impaction

- May still retain program-level impaction for high-demand programs such as Civil Engineering and Computer Science
- Currently, 17 total impacted programs

Currently:

CPP is the only CSU campus with Freshmen level impaction.



Direct Admissions Campuses

- ✓ 16 campuses participate in Direct Admissions
- ✓ 6 campuses are excluded
- ✓ Of those 6 campuses, 5 are fully impacted
- ✓ Cal Poly Pomona is the **only** non–fully impacted campus
 - Excluded because of our freshman-level impactation policy
 - Leading to the **perception** that CPP is fully impacted

You've already been accepted to sixteen California State Universities.

Based on your high school coursework and calculated GPA that we received from the Riverside County Office of Education, and in partnership with **CaliforniaColleges.edu**, you're eligible for admission to the California State University!

So where do you go from here?

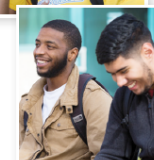
Research academic programs, take a virtual or in-person tour, and discover the CSU that's right for you.

Proposal 2: Program Impaction Addition (Freshmen only)

Business Administration – Finance, Real Estate, and Law (FRL)

Proposal:

- Program impact Business FRL at the freshmen level only

Justification:

- Historically, Business Administration – Finance, Real Estate, and Law (FRL) has been the only non-impacted program to deny out of local freshmen
- With the discontinuation of Freshmen campus level impaction, is at heightened risk of over-enrollment

Term	Applicants	Admits	Deny – CSU Eligible
Fall 2025	2,202	1,317	637
Fall 2024	2,027	1,082	718
Fall 2023	2,239	2,060	0

*In Fall 2023, an administrative oversight resulted in the admission of all CSU-eligible students, leading to an over enrollment of roughly 125 students and creating substantial strain on departmental resources.



Proposal 3: Program Impaction Modification (Transfer only)

Computer Science (CS)

Proposal:

- Modify MAT 1150 and PHY 1510/L from required to recommended

Justification:

- Each year, hundreds of CS transfers are denied for failing to meet all supplemental course requirements
- Broaden program eligible pool in light of downturn in applicants to the major, while still requiring critical prerequisite course (MAT 1140)
- Continues to incentivize transfers to complete other essential preparatory work

Summary Transfer Impaction Changes

- Discontinue Freshmen Level Impaction
- Impact Business Administration – Finance, Real Estate, and Law:
 - Freshmen level only
- Modify supplemental pre-requisite coursework for Computer Science
 - Transfer level only



Next Steps

- ✓ **January 28** – Submit preliminary proposal to CSU Chancellor's Office for review and approval
- ✓ **February 2** - Campuses receive tentative approval or denial for new or modified impactation requests from the Chancellor's Office
- ✓ **February 6** – Launch [public website](#)
- ✓ **February 11** - Publish plans in 3 three newspapers within the campus service area
- ✓ **Month of February** – Conduct campus consultations with enrollment planning group, student government, academic senate, college deans, college associate deans, AA AVPs, and department chairs
- ✓ **February 23-27** - Hold three public hearings in various locations/times in the service area of the affected campus. Post and retain comments or composites solicited at these hearings on the campus website
- **March 13** - Final Submission to the Chancellor's Office

In addition to holding public hearings, campuses must consult in a substantive manner with their Academic Senate, Associated Students and other relevant shared governance bodies to discuss the proposed changes and incorporate their feedback into the final submission.
