





- Where you can see which requirements for your degree that you've satisfied and which requirements you have left to complete





Transcripts and Transfer Credit

- If you think you already received credit for a course, let your orientation advisor know
- If you are enrolled in a summer course, be sure to send CPP your final transcripts as soon as you have final grades
- If you have copies of unofficial transcripts, have them handy today
- You can meet with an advisor in the fall to work on any paperwork

General Education Curriculum

- GE gives you a well-rounded education.
- You need to take 48 units of General Education.
 - 39 units of lower-division courses (1000-2000 level)
 - 9 units of upper-division courses (3000-4000 level)
- CPP changed the GE structure this year but Fall 2021 transfer students should follow the 2020-21 GE pattern.
- When you see Area F on your academic planning documents, ignore it. This is an incoming freshman requirement.




