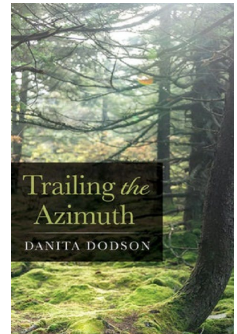
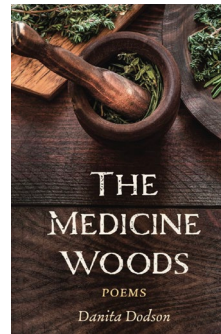

She is a prolific poet, publishing two books of poetry recently: *The Medicine Woods* (2022), a thoughtful vision of oneness of life as a planetary future; and *Trailing the Azimuth* (2021), a collection of poems in search for

directions, prompting a journey with mindfulness.

She holds a Ph.D. in twentieth-century American and British Literature from the University of Southern Mississippi. A former high school teacher for three decades, she currently teaches at the Walter State Community College.
