2023 National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) Inclusive Polytechnic Identity Summary Report

Cal Poly Pomona (CPP) is deeply committed to ensuring an educational experience that fosters student learning and success for every student. As part of that commitment, the Office of Assessment and Program Review participates in the nationwide National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) every three years to gather information as to the extent to which CPP is meeting this commitment. This survey collects information from first-year and senior students about their participation in programs and activities, what they have gained from their classes, the quality of interactions with faculty and students, as well as their satisfaction with educationally-important activities. Survey results are used to understand and improve student learning and experiences, and also assists the institution in addressing potential equity gaps, and identifying additional resources to improve the undergraduate experience.

In the Spring 2023 semester, all first-year and senior students were invited to participate in the NSSE; approximately 22% of these students completed the survey. A variety of recruitment messages were used to encourage student participation, including emails from President Coley, messages displayed on students' Bronco portal, and advertisements posted in the library. The first 500 respondents were provided with \$5 Bronco Bucks, and 10 seniors were randomly selected to receive \$100 Bronco Bucks.

CPP's NSSE results were compared with three peer groups. The table below outlines the approximate number of first-year and senior respondents from each category. The list of institutions for each of the comparative groups are detailed in appendices A and B.

Critical Thinking and Problem Solving

Critical thinking and problem solving are emphasized at Cal Poly Pomona by teaching students to apply theoretical principles learned in the classroom to real-world situations through active learning. These activities may include research, creative projects, performances, or culminating experiences. Critical thinking is also a student learning outcome adopted by the Academic Senate. NSSE grouped seven different questions together under the category Reflective and Integrative Learning (i.e., Academic Challenge).




Creativity, Discovery, and Innovation

Creativity, discovery, and innovation are at the core of Cal Poly Pomona's mission to provide tried and true methods to replicate real-world experiences into student learning.


Percentage of Freshmen's Planned and Seniors' Actual Participation in a Culminating Senior Experience.




Percentage of Freshmen's Planned and Seniors' Actual Participation in Faculty Research.




Percentage of Freshmen's Planned and Seniors' Actual Participation in an Internship, Field Experience, etc.



Percentage of Freshmen's Planned and Seniors' Actual Participation in a Learning Community.






Professional and Career Readiness

Summary and Highlights

Application of Knowledge:

- Both first-year students and seniors at CPP reported that their coursework emphasized applying facts, theories, or methods to practical problem or new solutions at similar levels as their comparison group peers.
- CPP seniors reported significantly fewer instances of including diverse perspectives in courses discussions and assignments in comparison peers at other institutions.

Critical Thinking and Problem Solving:

- First-year students reported engaging in various aspects of critical thinking and problem solving similarly to their comparison group peers, where as CPP seniors reported engaging significantly less in critical thinking and problem solving than their peers.
- CPP seniors reported combining ideas from different courses when completing assignments slightly more often than their comparison group peers.

Creativity, Discovery, and Innovation

- While the majority of first-year students planned to participate in a culminating senior experience, a slightly smaller percentage of seniors actually reported having done so.
- A greater percentage (27%) of CPP seniors reported participation in faculty research in comparison to their peers in comparison groups, including CSU (16%) and Master's-level institutions (18%).

Diverse and Multi-disciplinary Perspectives

- Both first-year and senior students included diverse perspectives (political, religious, racial/ethnic, gender, etc.) in course discussion or assignments less frequently than their comparison group peers.
- CPP's senior students had discussions with others of a different race or ethnicity, economic background, and religious beliefs more frequently than some of their comparison group peers.

Collaborative Learning

 Both first-year students and seniors reported interacting with fellow students significantly more often than their peers in the comparison groups, including working together to understand course material, preparing for exams, and on projects and assignments.

Community and Global Engagement

- The majority of CPP students reported 0 hours per week engaged in community service.
- First-year students reported less institutional emphasis on providing opportunities to be involved socially in comparison to their peer groups at other institutions, but slightly less than NSSE comparison universities.
- Both first-year and senior students felt that CPP emphasized attending "Some" events that address important social, economic, or political issues as often as their comparison group peers.
- A greater percentage of first-year students reported interest in studying abroad than seniors who reported
 participating. This pattern is consistent with our comparative groups.

Professional and Career Readiness

- First-year students discussed career plans with a faculty member statistically less frequently than their peers in comparison groups, but slightly more frequently than their CSU peers. Seniors, however, discussed their career plans with faculty just as frequently as their peers, but slightly more frequently than their CSU peers.
- A greater percentage of first-year students reported plans to participate in internships/field experiences than seniors who actually did so. This pattern is consistent with our comparison groups as well.
