

- Goal: understand student learning and experiences concerning their oral communication skills
- Report is key to identifying (potential) equity gaps
- Institutional & General Education (GE) learning outcome, and a WSCUC Core Competency




Data collection procedures

- Summer and Fall 2021 Faculty Recruitment
- Senior-level courses
- Video submissions as artifacts (COVID-19 situation)
- Designed, developed, refined rubric (APAC & GEAC) – central message, organization, language, and delivery/platform
- N = 115, 11 faculty's classes across 8 Colleges
- Representative sample across campus
- Winter break: norming and scoring by faculty




Results






Results by Gender
