OUR GRAD (cpp.edu)

Description

OUR GRAD Program prepares students for the application process itself in addition to helping them with the transition from undergraduate to graduate student. Students will get hands-on experience researching and selecting graduate programs, taking the GRE, and have opportunities to write and revise personal statements and statements of purpose.

Eligibility

- We recommend students who are freshman through junior standing with the intent to attend graduate programs to apply. Students who are in **senior standing** must meet with an advisor and create a work plan to be considered. Any student is welcome to attend the workshops regardless of program acceptance.
- Once accepted into the OUR GRAD Program, student should be in good standing (attending 7 or more workshops) before applying for fee waivers.
- A student must still be enrolled in CPP as an undergraduate student upon completion of the requirements of the program.
- Students from all majors and colleges at CPP are welcome to apply

Eligibility

To apply for this scholarship, students must meet the following requirements:

1. Submit proof of abstract acceptance (not eligible for this award if presenting at CPP

RSCA, CARS, SCCUR, and CSU Research Competition). In order to be eligible for

the scholarship, the applicant MUST be a named author that appears on the official

abstract acceptance.

2. The faculty mentor completes an evaluation form supporting the student's involvement

and contributions to the project.

3. To be eligible to receive a scholarship through Financial Aid the student must be enrolled

at least part-time during the current funding period.

Both undergraduate and graduate students can apply for a scholarship. Students can apply for the

scholarship multiple times but only one Conference Presentation Award can be awarded to a

student during the current funding period (e.g. August 19, 2019, through July 31, 2020).

Funding

The Conference Presentation Scholarship recognizes students whose research has been accepted

for a conference presentation.

AB540 students are eligible to receive Conference Presentation Scholarship funding. These

funds are not from a Federal grant and are strictly state funding. As an enrolled student, you are

eligible to apply for a scholarship.

Regional Conference or Student Conference: \$300

National Professional Conference: \$600

International Professional Conference: \$800

international Professional Conference: 5000

Note: It is not mandatory to present out of State, nor Internationally.

There is no deadline for applications. Applications are reviewed on the 2nd Friday of each month. Applications submitted after the 2nd Friday will be reviewed the following month. Since priority is given to students who have not yet presented their research, we encourage you to apply as soon as you receive notification of your conference abstract acceptance. Award notifications will be sent by the end of the month.

What to do once you've applied

Submit your Projects Hatchery application before 9:00 am on the Monday prior to the review date. The Hatchery Review Panel will review new applications on the third Thursday of every month. You will be notified within 48 hours of your status.

Majors

Be majoring in physics, astronomy, computer science or computer engineering.

Eligibility

To be eligible for Cal-Bridge, an applicant must:

• Currently be enrolled in a CSU or enrolled in a community college and transferring to a

CSU in the coming fall; acceptance to Cal-Bridge is contingent on enrollment in a CSU

by the fall of the Cal-Bridge application year.

• Have an expected graduation date in the 2022-2023 academic year.

• Demonstrate academic ability or potential.

• Be motivated to attend graduate school to study physics, astronomy, computer science or

computer engineering or related fields at a participating UC or another institution.

Only U.S. citizens or permanent residents are eligible to receive financial aid, but non-citizens

selected to be Cal-Bridge scholars may receive all the other benefits of the program. In addition,

sometimes private donations make it possible to give financial aid to non-citizens, and all

eligible students are encouraged to apply.

Funding

Cal-Bridge scholars will receive full scholarship support (up to \$10,000) for up to their last two

years of attendance at their home CSU institution, to the extent allowed by their demonstrated

financial need as determined by the financial aid office at their home institution.

Majors

Astronomy, physics, planetary and space science, or astrobiology

Eligibility

Applicants must be at least 18 years of age by the beginning of the program. Applicants must be enrolled in one of the CAMPARE participating institutions at the time of their application. For most sites, participants should not have graduated from their 4-year institution before the beginning of the summer internship, but some exceptions exist, so if you are graduating before next Spring, check each Research Opportunity page to confirm which you are eligible for. Community college students in the process of transferring to a 4-year institution are eligible to apply.

To be eligible for the program, applicants must have completed at least one full year of college-level physics by the summer of the program. For additional details of expectations and requirements for each site, visit the CAMPARE Research Opportunities pages.

We do encourage AB540/ California Dream Act students to apply. Some sites in the CAMPARE network are able to accept these students for Summer Research. Each site distributes their stipend/salary differently so that process will depend on which site a scholar is matched too.

Funding

Selected students will receive a stipend. In addition, participants will be provided with housing and reimbursement for travel from home or campus to the relevant research site.
