Dear faculty,

Welcome back to campus! I hope your summer has been restful and restorative!

Here's a super practical idea for the first day or so of class, or the first activity if you have an asynchronous component: **Take 15 minutes to have students pull out their calendars and block in time, both class meetings and 4-10 hours* per week outside of class meetings, for the semester.** Have them put in dates such as exams and project due dates, and -- bonus -- exam review and project *start* dates. From first-year classes to final graduate seminars, this is a productive investment of first-day time. You can do it along with them, blocking out time for feedback (i.e. grading).

We all say in our syllabus or in class, "This class will take time! You need to count on spending many hours every week outside of class!" We can make it tangible, help students to see and to save the space that our class requires in their lives.

Here's some <u>more first-day ideas</u>. Also, if you're still finalizing your syllabus, here are some <u>sample</u> <u>syllabi and checklists</u>, along with some covid safety language for Fall 2022.

Canvas news: Please make sure your course is published, and that modules and items that you want students to see are published. PS. *For the hours per week outside of class, be honest. Don't ask students to block 10 hours if 3 hours is realistic. If it is realistically 10-15 hours outside of class, tell them why so much time is needed and help them see that it's normal to need a lot of time. Sometimes students think they're not "good enough at this" if they can't do things fast, and that's not true.
