Dear faculty,

I got an email that mentioned the "stress and overwhelming feeling of beginning Week 9." Six more weeks plus final exams feels like -- a lot. For both your students and yourself, you might consider if there's something in your class that you don't really need to do. Think about a "must do, should do, could do" diagram. Most faculty like the "could do" area in classes because we have so thoroughly internalized the must-do's and even the should-do's; the could-do's are more exciting.

Without giving up exciting, is there <u>one</u> could-do that you might let go or change somewhat to ease pressure while meeting the same learning goals? For example: Instead of a 2-page assignment, could a 5-minute in-class index card get at the same objective? Could you take out one sub-topic and instead give time in class to work on the problem set? Must they memorize that fifth piece or would it be okay to allow music for the performance? Thoughtfully assessing activities and carefully deciding not to do something does not undermine rigor, it increases functionality.
