Subject: Strategies to get high completion rates for student evaluations

Dear faculty,

You may have seen the email from the Office of Faculty Affairs on Thursday Nov. 10, about student evaluations for our courses. (Here's the <u>full text</u>, for convenience.). Evaluation surveys will open Sunday Nov. 27 through 11:59pm Sunday Dec. 11.

Here are four ideas for getting better response rates. Some CPP faculty who used these strategies in Spring 2022 had response rates of 80+%!

- Give time in class for your students to complete their surveys for your class. (For an asynchronous class, this isn't relevant, but the other tips are). If you teach synchronously (online or face to face), you can set a specific time for the evaluations during your class period; see <u>instructions to do so</u>.
- Tell your students about a change you made in your teaching for them based on past student surveys. Knowing that their opinions will be acted upon is motivating.
- Provide an <u>academically related</u> reward to the entire class, not to individuals. E.g. "If we get X% response, everyone can indicate a question on the exam that they want to get double points for" or something along those lines. You can set the response rate bar high, 85-90%, if you are concerned about some students getting a reward they didn't earn.
- By the way, non-academic rewards (cookies, prize drawing) are *not* useful.
