Dear faculty,

Here's an important reminder for your to-do list: **Take time after grades are in to look through any courses or organizations you have on Blackboard.** Cal Poly Pomona's contract with Blackboard ends June 2023. After that, *no one* will be able to get data from Blackboard, including CAFE and IT&IP. Make a plan to get materials and information you want to save. CAFE and IT&IP can't provide individual support (i.e. we can't do it for you but we can show you how). See CAFE's <u>Transitioning from</u> <u>Blackboard</u> site for more information, tutorials, and how to get help.

Also, I want to amplify last week's note about grades! Connie Kuang, our Interim Registrar, gave me some corrections, details, and nuances. Please see her information immediately below; also, all faculty who are teaching this semester should have received an email from the Registrar directly.

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End of semester grade information from Registrar:

- Faculty members issuing a "WU" grade must specify the student's **last date of attendance**. Although the "WU" grade has a similar GPA impact as the "F" grade, an "F" grade should ONLY be assigned to students who have **completed**the course but fail to meet the minimum requirements of the course and is clearly below university quality. The grade of "WU" is specifically issued to students who initially enrolled in the class and at some point stopped attending but did not withdraw from the course and failed to complete course requirements.
- Students must initiate the request for an Incomplete. If a student requests an **Incomplete ("I")** grade and you support this request, please finalize the **Incomplete Grade Agreement** located in your grade roster in <u>BroncoDirect</u>; an Incomplete Grade Agreement must be created, or the final grade roster will not be approved. If the student did not request an Incomplete, you should not give a student an incomplete grade. An "I" grade must normally be made up within one calendar year immediately following the end of the term during which it was assigned. For serious and compelling reasons to extend, such as military service or severe medical reasons, the instructor must initiate the extension request and submit the <u>Grade Extension Petition</u> to the Registrar's Office. Click the <u>Faculty & Staff Resources</u> section

on the Registrar's Office website on instructions: "<u>How to Create Incomplete Grade Agreement in</u> <u>BroncoDirect</u>."

• The **Report in Progress ("RP")** is used in connection with courses that extend beyond one academic term and are authorized only for specific courses. The "RP" grade means that the work in progress is evaluated satisfactory to date, yet the assignment of a precise grade must await the completion of additional course work. All work is completed within one calendar year from the date of the first assignment of an "RP," and a final grade will be assigned. For master's degree thesis or projects (6950, 6960), the time limit is two years. Any extension of this time must receive prior authorization; submit a <u>Grade Extension Petition</u> to the Registrar's Office.
