Dear faculty,

I hope everyone is well and safe, given the potentially dangerous weather. It's beautiful to look at the snow on the mountains but not so great if you don't have a warm home to return to.

This is a good time to remind students about the <u>CPP Care Center</u>. You very likely have at least a couple of students who are experiencing some level of food and/or housing insecurity (<u>CSU Basic Needs Initiative</u>research). The Care Center is a first-stop center for wellbeing and basic needs resources; students can find housing and food assistance, plus advocacy and help in finding academic support. I like to send a Canvas announcement and create a slide to show in class, urging students to get in touch with the <u>Care Center</u> and to tell their friends about it.

You can also refer a student whose well-being concerns you.

For us faculty, if you need help or know a colleague who might, <u>CPP Life Matters by Empathia</u> provides employee assistance. They can confidentially help faculty and staff get connected with appropriate services and resources.

Also, here's another useful Canvas tip: Get a list of student emails from Canvas New Analytics.

- Select the New Analytics navigation menu item (you may need to enable it)
- 2. Select Reports
- 3. Select Roster
- 4. **Download a csv file**. It will have student names, emails, BID, and section.
