Dear faculty,

I have several somewhat disparate but hopefully all useful notes this week:

- 1. Dr. Erin DeRosa from the Office of Student Success sent me this reminder: Please do not suggest to students that they should petition to "Withdraw for Serious and Compelling Reasons" because they may fail the class. The withdrawal policy explicitly prohibits withdrawing for this reason. If a student submits a petition with "failing the course" as the reason, the petition must be denied. If the student is failing a course because of a serious and compelling reason, they should give the serious and compelling reason. There are other options to support a student who's failing, including course repetition and grade forgiveness. Please contact Student Success for help and ideas.
- 2. Here's an oldie but goodie tip for wrapping up the semester: The end-of-semester checklist.
- 3. If learning something new for yourself sounds good (after a semester of supporting others to learn, as amazing as that is!), consider attending the <u>Academic Innovations Summer Conference</u>, May 31 June 2: *Pathways to the Future: Exploring the Intersection of Learning, Work, and Community*.
