Dear faculty,

Remember last week's message from a professor who had implemented a couple of helpful practices? Well, here's another great idea from that colleague:

On my second midterm I ask, "What surprises you most about this class?", with a tiny bit of extra credit. One student who already works in [the industry] gives off a knows-a-lot vibe and refuses to participate in group work. It's exasperating but I have been mentally giving them the benefit of the doubt instead of getting upset, and I'm glad because here's their response to the extra credit question:

"I knew this class was not going to be easy but this is more challenging than expected. I'm surprised how improperly trained I was by other [industry workers]. I knew I was not thoroughly learned on all things in [this industry], but I did not realize how much information I've been missing."

To me, this anecdote is a complex example of growth mindset toward students: Checking in and getting to know students individually, but systematically. Realizing that the surface is not the whole. Having compassion while maintaining high standards. Providing a trustworthy classroom where an admission of struggle can be made – and therefore, maybe the challenge met.
