We got an <u>email from Faculty Affairs</u> this week about student evaluations. There's a lot of good information and links in that email that I will not repeat here. Instead, here's the email I plan to send to my students on Sunday Nov. 19, encouraging them to complete the evaluation.

Hello everyone,

<u>Student evaluations</u> are now open and available for you to complete! Please look at the left-hand navigation menu in our Canvas course, or go to MyCPP and log in there. I really value your feedback about the class and you have my promise that it will be used. For example, our individual-plus-group quizzes and the late tokens were the result of prior student comments and feedback.

In fact, your feedback is so valuable that we'll do two things:

- 1. Although you can do the evaluation survey any time from now to Dec. 3., we will take time during class on Nov. 27 for you to do them.
- 2. *If we get a 95% completion rate on the surveys (yes, I can see the completion rate but no I cannot see your individual survey), everyone will get to indicate one question of their choice on the final exam that they want to count 1.5 times as much. In other words if you think you did great on a question, that one counts extra. If you didn't do great on the question I won't take off extra, so this is a no-lose situation. But ONLY if we get to 95% completion rate! So, contribute to the cause and to a great class for my next group of students.

*I only have 25 students, we're fully f2f, and I have good attendance, so I feel comfortable demanding 95% completion and allowing the reward customization. Adjust as needed for your course.
