Dear faculty,

As we are in finals week, CAFE is getting a lot of questions about Turnitin's AI reports and what to do when the report indicates a high percentage of AI use in an assignment. I'm also getting questions about the use of writing support AI tools such as Grammarly.

There is no university-level policy regarding how much or what kind of AI use is acceptable in courses. That is, the university offers academic freedom to faculty in determining our own response to AI use or misuse in our classes.

Here is my best effort at summarizing the current tools we have on campus and my recommendations for proceeding.

Here's a micro-summary: 1) For Fall 2023, use your stated syllabus policies as well and consistently as you can. 2) Do not rely on Turnitin's Al report without your own further investigation and careful judgement. 3) Longer term, talk to your colleagues and try to reach a consensus at least in your department.
