### Dear faculty,

I've been pondering this short article, <u>Busting the System Myth</u>, from one of my favorite academic thinkers. To summarize, "If you are in a position to [make big reforms]...great, go for it! But if you're in a situation where the best you can do is one small thing, then there is good news. Doing one small thing is real progress...."

So here is a tiny idea to help your student learn more: Increase your "wait time." Most instructors give a wait time of **less than three seconds** after posing a question or discussion prompt to students, which is barely enough time for students to mentally process the end of the sentence, let alone formulate an answer they are confident enough to verbalize, especially if you've asked a pretty good question! See if you can wait 15, or even 30 seconds. You can say, "I'm going to give you some time to make some notes on the question I just asked." Giving students a small task helps alleviate the discomfort of silence. Meanwhile, you can count the seconds. See <u>Ingram & Elliott</u> (2014) for a scholarly treatment of wait time.

Also, please consider sharing your ideas and expertise -- presentation proposals for CAFE, Student Success, and IRPA's <u>Equity in Practice</u> symposium are due tomorrow, Friday March 1! No idea is too small, or too large, to share.
