How can we have discussions that risk raising the temperature and impact the learning environment, but that deal with critically important issues and touch our students, and us, deeply? What do we do when comments are hurtful and problematic but don't get to threatening or harassing? How can we enrich rather than exclude and harm?

There is **for sure** no simple or short answer, so CAFE will work with experts both on and off campus to provide a series of posts, workshops, and resources throughout spring, summer, and fall.
