## Faculty Career Growth

- Register for Mental Health First Aid Training (offered by the Chancellor’s Office)  
Join over 1,400 CSU faculty who have become certified in Mental Health First Aid to be prepared to support wellbeing for students and everyone in our communities. This training, offered by the CSU Innovative Teaching and Learning Programs especially for faculty and facilitated by CSU faculty who are certified Mental Health First Aid instructors, teaches participants to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental health challenges and substance use disorders. This spring’s sessions will be facilitated by Dr. Sailesh Maharjan (San Bernardino).

*Registration for two Spring 2026 Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) Training cohorts is now open. It will remain open until sessions reach capacity and wait lists are full.*

The National Council for Mental Wellbeing has developed Mental Health First Aid certification training (MHFA 2.0), which teaches how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders.

This certification training, valued at \$175 per participant, is free to CSU faculty willing to complete the training to become certified. The National Council for Mental Wellbeing limits capacity for each session to allow the instructor to interact with all participants.
