- **Writing as Thinking in STEM Workshop | University Writing Committee**

Wednesday, March 18, 2026 | 12:00–1:00 PM (via [Zoom](#))

In this interactive workshop, faculty will explore how writing functions as a core component of scientific and technical thinking—not as an add-on to content. Drawing on examples from engineering and STEM courses, this session reframes writing as a tool for reasoning, inquiry, and disciplinary learning.

This session is especially useful for faculty teaching lab-based, project-based, or writing-intensive STEM courses and for anyone interested in reducing grading burden while improving student thinking and clarity. All Cal Poly Pomona faculty and lecturers are welcome.

Registration for the **2026 AI Hackathon** is now open. The Hackathon is open to **all CPP students**, undergraduate and graduate, from every major.

This year, the AI Hackathon has incorporated greater flexibility and expanded access to tools that will empower students to address real-world challenges using artificial intelligence. Students will have nearly two weeks to complete the challenge, and the hackathon challenges are provided by industry sponsors. The AI Hackathon will offer accelerated live technical training sessions, which will be recorded for later access. Registered students will receive access to a dedicated Canvas course containing session recordings, technical resources, and additional

support materials. At the end, Hackathon participants will earn a digital badge in recognition of their work.

The Equity in Action Grant Program invests resources back into the CSU system to identify, understand, and disrupt inequities that impact students' opportunities to learn, engage, progress, and complete. The program is designed to support innovative thinking, research, and evidence-based practices that lead to meaningful institutional change and improved student outcomes.

For 2026, the Network invites proposals across two funding tracks: Pilot Projects ranging from \$10,000 to \$20,000 and Scaling Projects ranging from \$50,000 to \$100,000. Projects that advance cross-divisional collaboration, multi-institutional partnerships, and direct funding to students will receive special consideration.

Students, staff, and faculty across the CSU are encouraged to review the full RFP and submission guidelines for detailed eligibility requirements, competitive priorities, and proposal components.

Proposals are due by March 27th.
