


### Singelyn Center for Innovative Analytics: GIS Workshop Series




### ARAMARK GUEST SPEAKERS



listening, working with the virtual room and even career insights into global trade logistics. Thank you Amy for shedding light on this business etiquette; which truly allows us to mobilize our net worth.




### CAREERS DISCUSSION PANEL


