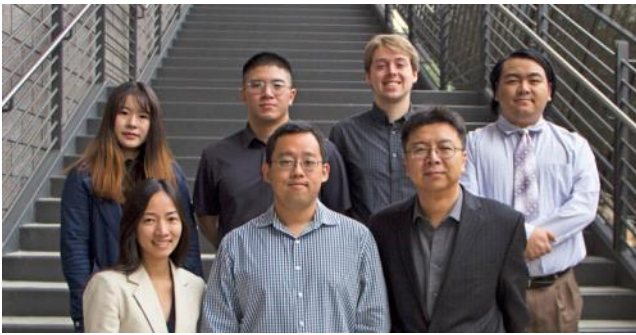
Student Club Highlights
