



PUMPKIN SHAPE COUNT

Theme: Halloween/Crafting

Curriculum area: Math/Visual Arts

Ages of Children: 4th-6th grade (9-12 years old)

Materials needed:

1. Construction paper (black, green, orange)
2. Circles, triangles, and Squares
3. Scissors
4. Pencil
5. Glue

Developmental Objectives/Domain:

1. Students will be able to create different shapes on their own and with this they will gain understanding of how a different shape looks.
2. They will challenge themselves by thinking about the number of shapes they need to make their pumpkin look good and scary.

Procedure:

1. Obtain your black and orange construction paper.
2. With the orange paper cut out an oval shape to have it be your pumpkin.
3. Then proceed to decorate your pumpkin the way you want, but with different shapes they can't all be the same.
4. After you complete decorating your pumpkin, write down how many shapes of each shape you used using a white piece of paper, and then proceed to glue it down below your pumpkin.
5. Do not forget to write your name when you are done
