Life Cycle of a Chicken



Theme: On the Farm

Curriculum Area: Science

Activity: You can discuss the life cycle of a chicken. I have done this activity before and it is unforgettable.

Age of Children: 4-5 years of age

Materials Needed: Pretty much everyone knows somebody who owns a friendly chicken

 Printer, paper, markers, velcro, laminator, laminating sleeves, scissors, a baby chick.

Developmental Domains/ Objectives:

- 1. COG 11: knowledge of the natural world
- 2. They will be able to recall the life cycle of a chicken better.

Procedure:

- 1. Print out a picture of an egg, chick and chicken.
- Laminate the pictures and velcro them in order on a laminated board. Then, show them the board and explain. Allow the children to interact with the board and take the pictures off.
- Get a live chick.
- 4. Ask the children questions while showing them the chick:
 - a. Do you look like a chick? Why or why not?

- b. Does the chick's mouth look like your mouth?
 - i. A chick's mouth is called a **beak**.
- c. Does the chick's arm look like your arms?
 - i. Chicks have wings.
- d. Do you have more or less toes than a chick?
 - i. Chicks have 3 on each foot.
- e. Do your toenails look like the chicks?
 - i. Chickens have claws.
- f. Is the chick soft? Why?
 - i. Chicks have down feathers.
