

**Early Completion Option (ECO)
for Multiple Subject and Single Subject Intern Program
Candidates CPP Process for Intern ECO**

The Early Completion Option (ECO) is intended to provide individuals who have requisite skills and knowledge an opportunity to challenge the course work portion of a Multiple Subject (MS) or Single Subject (SS) Intern Credentialing Program. The Early Completion Option **does not waive the entire program but allows for an expedited pathway by waiving preparation program coursework** for those candidates who meet the criteria.

Steps in the ECO Process:

1. Applicant submits the online application for ECO, with the required evidence.
2. **Application and evidence is reviewed by the Credential Analyst**

Application Checklist:

- Applicant is enrolled in the CPP Credential Program
 - Applicant has submitted an application for the Intern Program
 - Applicant has passed National Evaluation Series (NES) Assessment of Professional Knowledge (APK): Elementary (Test code 051) for Multiple Subjects candidates or Secondary (Test code 052) for Single Subject candidates (attached score evidence)
 - Applicant has passed both TPA's on the first attempt (attached evidence)
 - Applicant has received an offer of employment for a teaching position that matches the credential sought. (attached contract or job offer)
 - Applicant presents evidence of successful completion of a course (two semester units or three quarter units) in the provisions and principles of the U.S. Constitution, or passage of an examination in the subject given by a regionally accredited college, or university.
3. Applicant is interviewed by the Intern Coordinator.
 4. Application is approved/denied by the Credential Coordinator (MS or SS)
 5. Applicant is notified of results.
 6. If Approved for ECO, the Applicant meets with the Program Coordinator to establish the ECO Program Plan and adjustments to the initial program plan.
 7. The Credential Analyst collaborates with the school district to complete the hiring

process for the internship.
