Concept

This project will serve as a workshop/learning+connection event that will explore the Afro-Latino diaspora, focusing on the intersection of culture, heritage, and identity through storytelling and visual art. The purpose is to bring engagement in discussions about the influence of Afro-Latino roots on personal and collective identities, and how food plays a vital role in preserving these traditions. By creating visual and symbolic representations of dishes from Afro-Latino cultures, I hope to connect the experience of food to the broader narrative of identity, memory, and community. This will include a coloring sheet (still trying to connect my OG idea) that will serve as an expressive art form for all those that participate and a chance to learn more about this richness of the foods we all love and enjoy.

Goals

Cultural and Educational: Deepen awareness of Afro-Latino heritage through the lens of food, storytelling, and art + Encourage reflection on personal identity and how food shapes our understanding of self and belonging.

Explore the intersection of African and Latin American cultural identities in a way that is accessible and inclusive.

Create a safe, affirming space for Afro-Latino individuals and allies to share stories and build community.

Introduce expressive, hands-on elements that encourage participants to contribute to a collective narrative.



- Despite being an essential part of Latino identity, Afro-Latinos remain widely overlooked in the United States. According to the Pew Research Center, 1 in 4 Latinos in the U.S. identifies as Black (Pew Research Center), yet our histories and contributions are often erased from mainstream narratives. In Los Angeles—home to 47,000 Afro-Latinos—we saw firsthand how invisibility in education, the arts, and cultural representation impacted our communities. This realization fueled our commitment to expanding our reach, ensuring Afro-Latinos everywhere have the recognition, resources, and platforms they deserve."
