I. Catalog Description

Weekly individual instructional lessons. Repertoire and technical studies determined by option selected as appropriate for flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, or saxophone. Jury examination required. Total credit limited by option. Course not available to non-majors except by special audition. Enrollment limited to Bachelor of Music majors only. Repeatable up to 6 units

II. Required Coursework and Background

Prerequisite(s): Minimum performance requirement posted in Music Department.

Permission to enroll by audition only.

Co-requisite(s): MU 2770 and appropriate ensemble.

Flute

The student will be asked to perform 2 contrasting pieces. One should be a piece from the standard repertoire and one should be an etude by Andersen, Kohler or Garibaldi. The student should be able to perform the following Major scales (2 octaves): C, G, D, A, F, Bb, and Eb. The student should also be able to play a two octave chromatic scale.

Clarinet

The student will be asked to perform two contrasting pieces. One should be an etude (from 32 Etudes, by Camille Rose). The student will be asked to show capability of performing each piece with rhythmic accuracy and musical understanding. The student should be able to perform the following Major Scales (two octaves): C, G, F, D, Bb, A and Eb as well as a full range Chromatic Scale (from E below the treble staff to F above the treble staff).

Oboe

The student will be asked to perform two contrasting pieces; a classical etude from the Barret, A Complete Method for the Oboe, or Ferling, 48 Famous Studies and a classical solo from a major sonata or concerto comparable to Bach, Handel and Telemann. He/she will be asked to show capability of performing each piece with some rhythmic accuracy and musical understanding. The student should be able to perform all Major Scales as well as a full range Chromatic Scale. All scales should be slurred and two octaves when possible.

Bassoon

The student will be required to memorize and play all major and minor scales, as well as a chromatic scale through the entire range of the instrument. In addition, two contrasting études from Milde Concert Studies (or equivalent) and a movement of a standard concerto (Mozart, Weber, Vivaldi) must be performed.

Saxophone

The student will be asked to perform two contrasting pieces (may be classical etude, classical solo, jazz solo or pop style solo that covers the entire range of the horn). He/she will be asked to show capability of performing each piece with rhythmic accuracy and musical understanding. The student should be able to perform the following Major Scales (encompassing the range of the of the saxophone): C, G, F, D, Bb, A, Eb, E and Ab as well as a full range Chromatic Scale.

III. Expected Outcomes

The student will be able to perform:

- 1. A specified amount of repertoire as a result of the work on the selected instrument.
- 2. A specified amount of technical studies.

The outcomes of this course relate to the following Music Department Student Learning Outcomes:

- 1. Perform a variety of music with expression and musical accuracy.
- 3. Demonstrate musicianship skills (including those involving technology) and conceptual understandings.
- 4. Demonstrate and articulate personal growth as a musician and student of music in the world.

- 1. **demonstrate** a high level of musicianship that facilitates independent preparation of music for performance.
- 2. **utilize** current/recent technologies appropriate to the musical endeavor.
