## I. Catalog Description

Concert Band is open to all music majors and non-music majors interested in performing traditional and contemporary concert band literature.

## II. Required Coursework and Background

Enrollment by audition. All members must have prior experience on a wind or percussion instrument and audition for seat placement.

## III. Expected Outcomes

- Students will be prepared for successful careers in music or enjoyment of music through performance.
- Students will create the finest ensemble possible through performing quality repertoire at a high level of music making.
- Students will encounter new and challenging artistic experiences that promote individual musicianship, aesthetic and emotional growth.
- Students will perform at a consistently high artistic standard in rehearsals and in performance.
- Students will promote wind repertoire as an exciting medium for musical enjoyment and growth through performance, commissioning projects, and collaborating with guest artists, conductors and composers.

## IV. Instructional Materials

A library of works for the wind band medium is available for performance. Auxiliary readings and resources as deemed appropriate for the repertoire.

## V. Minimum Student Material

Musical instrument, pencil, mutes (brass), reeds (woodwinds), sticks/mallets (percussion), music folder, sheet music.

## VI. Minimum College Facilities

A rehearsal room large enough for the ensemble with adequate sound insulation.
Audio-visual system and recording equipment.

## VII. Course Outline

Sight reading of repertoire
Week by week rehearsing of assigned repertoire.
Working out the details: rehearsing, recording, modifying, polishing.

## VIII. Instructional Methods

Rehearsal and lecture modes will be used.

## IX. Evaluation of Outcomes

Grades are awarded on the basis:

1. Attendance
2. Accuracy in performance of individual parts.
3. Improvement during the semester.

A formal public concert of approximately 60 minutes will be given near the end of the semester. It takes the place of a final exam. In the event that a public performance is not scheduled, the class will meet during the assigned final exam time for an informal performance/presentation of its accomplishments.
