If you started Fall 2025 or later, you follow the new GE pattern. This new pattern uses codes that start with numbers, like Area 4B. Ignore the older GE pattern, which uses codes that start with letters, like Area D2.

### American Institutions Requirement Could add 3 additional units

All CSU students must demonstrate proficiency and understanding of American History, the Constitution, and American Government. GE Area 4B satisfies the American Government portion: PLS 2010. However, students also must demonstrate proficiency in American History: HST 2201 (4A), HST 2202 (4A), or HST 3340 (4C).

### University Writing Requirement (UWR)

Political science majors complete writing-intensive coursework, receiving a grade of C or better in at least 3 units. Students have two opportunities to pass the University Writing Requirement, either in the fall or spring semester of Senior Capstone (Senior Internship or Senior Thesis).
