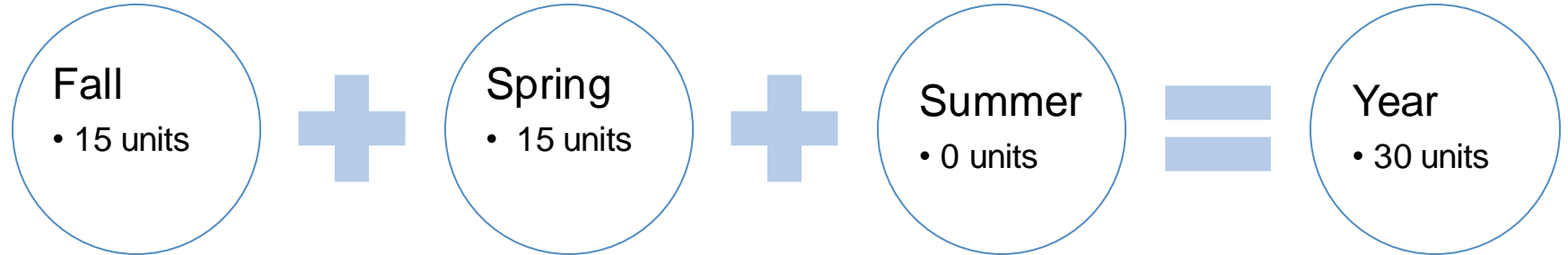

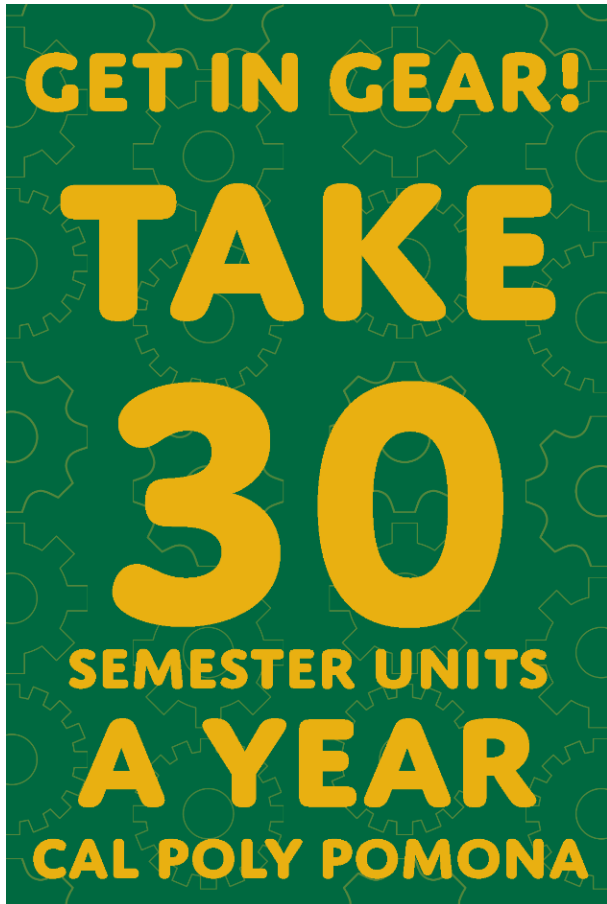
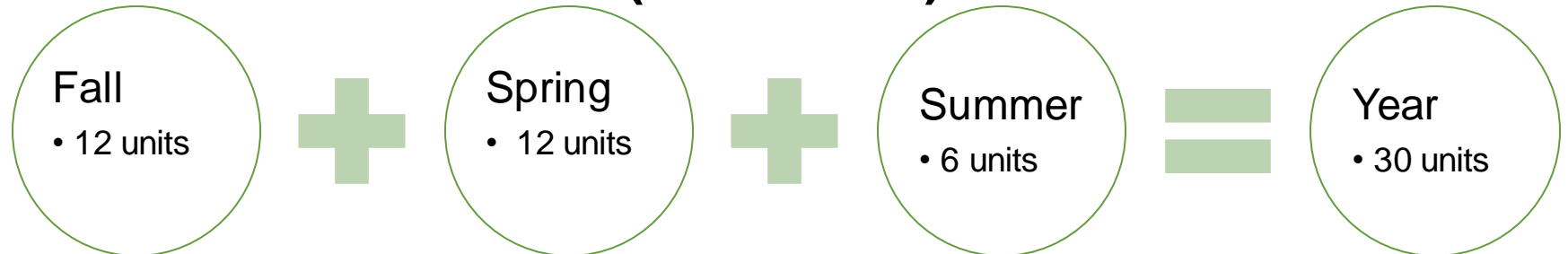
Standard Class Load

Every student must complete a senior project. This is a two-semester sequence that **ONLY** begins in the fall semester. Enroll in one of these in Fall 2021.

D. Unrestricted Electives

Remember, you need **120 units** to graduate.

After taking the required GE and political science courses, you will still be short the required 120 units to graduate.

Unrestricted electives are any classes at the university that you want to take, merely to fulfill the unit count. They can be more upper-division political science courses, but they can be Theater classes, Kinesiology classes, food classes...

Some of your community college courses will count as unrestricted electives. You will have at least 15 units of unrestricted electives.

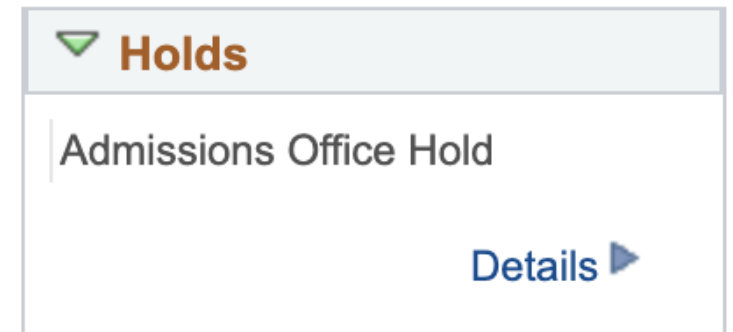

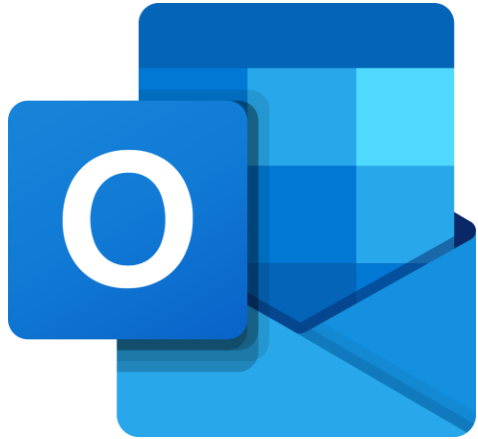

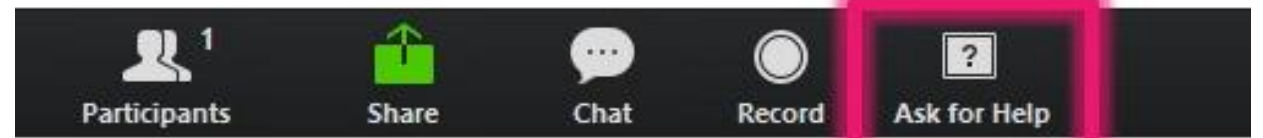
