DESIGN & TECHNICAL PRODUCTION

- **The Design and Technical Production program offers courses in all theatrical design areas, as well as stage management and specialty classes including Drafting, Scenic Painting and the History of Dress. We produce a significant number of productions per year, and our program is based on providing opportunities for students to work hands-on. Students receive meaningful one-on-one attention from faculty and staff, and take on leadership roles in our productions so they are prepared to enter the job market or seek a graduate training. Whether you are well-versed in a particular area, or looking to explore options and gain experience, we are here for you.**

ACTING

- **The Acting program consists of various courses based in technique and the development of skills essential in performance work for the actor. Courses such as Acting (Stanislavsky and Meisner, among others), emphasis on style work such as Shakespeare and Chekhov, Linklater Voice, Movement, Directing, On-Camera work in Business of Acting, and Filmmaking are a few of our offerings. Our courses have a specific progression of skill sets from beginning to intermediate to advanced levels of classes. Analytical work and critically thinking skills are explored in Text Analysis. Performance opportunities include student-written one acts, students films, to the performance work offered in studio and main stage productions, Freshmen Showcase and summer performance opportunities in the Southern California Shakespeare Festival, SCSF.**

DANCE THEATRE

An experimental interdisciplinary (dance, acting, text, physical theatre) practice, emergent and wholistic with an emphasis on process, collaboration, and immersive. Opportunities include: Performance Ensemble, Dance Concert, American College Dance Association (ACDA) and Festival.

THEATRE IN EDUCATION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- **This option prepares students for work in education (teaching drama in K-12) and community engagement, primarily through community-based theatre. Featured in American Theatre Magazine as a nationally recognized program teaching Theatre for Social Justice.**

GENERAL

- **This option enables students to develop a broad theatre curriculum with primary interests in directing, playwriting, management, or theory and criticism in order to create a course of study that best suits their goals.**
