DIRECTOR'S NOTES

As You Like It is one of my favorite plays. It's full of vibrant and distinct characters. It's a play of dichotomies: touching love scenes side by side with raucous fights, philosophical discourses on the nature of melancholy butting up against slapstick physical comedy. All of it contained in an elegant plot that intersects numerous storylines into one delicious whole.

The main thread of the story is the journey of two cousins, Celia and Rosalind, that are the best of friends. Celia is the daughter of the current Duchess, Frederica. As the play opens, Frederica has stolen the crown from her sister, and banished the former Duchess to the forest of Arden. Rosalind (the banished Duchess's daughter) has remained in the city, detained there by Frederica to be Celia's companion.

In another part of the city, there are two brothers embroiled in a similar dynamic. Oliver is the unkind and angry older brother who has stolen his younger brother, Orlando's, inheritance. In despair over this, Orlando decides to enter into a wrestling match that could very well end in his death

And so Rosalind, Celia, Duchess Frederica, and Orlando all end up at the wrestling match, where Rosalind and Orlando fall instantly in love. However, Duchess Frederica becomes enraged and banishes Rosalind. Celia, in turn, swears she will never leave Rosalind's side. The two cousins decide to escape to the Forest of Arden to seek Rosalind's banished mother. They go in disguise, with Rosalind dressed as a young man. Upon arrival, they find the forest more welcoming than anticipated, more full of sweet possibility. Celia, looking about their new home, remarks, "I like this place, and willingly could waste my time in it."

Meanwhile, Orlando's elder brother, Oliver, is furious his brother has survived the wrestlers, and plots to kill Orlando by setting fire to his home while he is asleep. Warned by a trusty friend, Orlando determines to run away from the city. And thus, they all end up in the forest of Arden. There the city dwellers must learn to live side by side with the country folk, and the two communities go on to form unexpected bonds of friend-ship and love.

Early in this rehearsal process, the actors, stage management team, and I engaged in a lively discussion about the broader themes of *As You Like It*. Reflecting on the nature of what happens when people from different backgrounds come together, we realized *As You Like It* is in some ways about how community forms. Are the bonds of love stronger than fear? How do disparate people find points of connection? Further, we

reflected on the ways the play expresses the tension between artifice and authenticity: how is it that we become our true selves?

Of course, that we are creating this production in a college setting is part of the unique story of our play. It's an honor for me to work with so many talented, young theater artists (actors, stage managers, and designers) as they embark on their own journeys of self-discovery. For what is college but a time to explore how to build a community while still honoring our unique selves? The fact that for many of us this was the first in-person theater experience since the start of the pandemic made the experience all the sweeter. Often, arriving at the theater for rehearsal, I would remark to myself, as Celia does, "I like this place, and willingly could waste my time it." Thank you for being here to experience Arden with us. We hope you like this place, too!


