The 5,700-square-foot lab is named in honor of alumni **Don Miller** and **Ron Simons** from a \$1 million gift by **Butch** and **Vivien Lindley**. Miller had the original idea to enter the 1949 Rose Parade. Simons is a retired CPP administrator and longtime champion for Rose Float.

At 60 feet long, the Tournament of Roses Legacy
Fence will feature 120 stainless steel tiles, each with
the name and year of past and future floats. The fence
was designed by alumnus **Joe Vertrees**.
