Student Achievement

In the final year of the BSURP program, students complete a senior project under the guidance of a faculty supervisor. Additionally, the students must present their senior project research in the form of a poster. Members of the Board of Directors of the Inland, Orange, and Los Angeles sections of the American Planning Association, as well as local planning professionals are invited to the poster session, and asked to score the posters using a rubric comprised of five criteria: 1) problem definition, 2) planning knowledge, 3) research design, 4) communication skills, 5) ethical reasoning.

34 senior project posters were presented to local APA chapter board members and planning professionals on May 18, 2023. Overall, the average rating scale was "exceeds expectations." Criterion by criterion:
