Student Achievement

In their final year, MURP students complete two capstone course sequences: a thesis or a client project. Students who select a client project are required to invite an external committee member. The external members were asked to score the projects using rubric comprised of five criteria: 1) problem definition, 2) planning knowledge, 3) research design, 4) communication skills, 5) ethical reasoning.

11 client projects were presented to and evaluated by the external members. Following are the distributions of the evaluation scores.
