# What NOT to bring for all UHS Residents



## What Not to Bring

- ☐ Any open-coil or open-flame appliances
  - *toaster or toaster oven, fondue pot, Instant Pots, George Foreman grill, etc.*
- ☐ Full-sized refrigerator
  - *refer to the first page under Optional regarding the size of mini fridge allowed if you are a Residential Hall resident only*
- ☐ Halogen lamps
- ☐ Extra bed/mattress
- ☐ Incense/candles
- ☐ 3D Printers of any kind
- ☐ Alcohol
  - *unless you are 21 years of age or over*
- ☐ Drugs/drug paraphernalia
- ☐ Weapons
- ☐ Pets
  - *other than freshwater fish in a 10 gallon or smaller tank*
- ☐ Wireless or wired router
- ☐ Wallpaper or contact paper
- ☐ Vape devices or other electronic smoking devices
- ☐ Hookahs or other smoking devices/paraphernalia
- ☐ Grills and materials for grills
- ☐ Water-filled furniture
- ☐ LED lights with adhesive strips
- ☐ Steamers
- ☐ Space heaters
- ☐ Air conditioners including portable units
