

### **Monitoring Your Symptoms**

As you plan your return to campus, it is essential that you monitor your symptoms prior to coming to campus. If you are experiencing any symptoms, do not come to campus – either complete the Health Screener or email [healthscreeener@cpp.edu](mailto:healthscreeener@cpp.edu) to be cleared and notify your Housing staff.

As a reminder, you must complete the Health Screener prior to coming to campus. Students living on campus must complete the Health Screener daily

### **Testing Recommendations and Requirements**

We strongly recommend that you test at least 48 hours prior to returning to campus, especially if you know were exposed to COVID-19 in the last 10 days, or travelled domestically or internationally, or experiencing symptoms.

All students living on campus, are **required to test at the Public Health Testing location, regardless of vaccination status. Students should test on the day of arrival and required to do so no later than 48 hours from date of arrival.**

### **Face Coverings**

To adhere to state, county public health guidelines and continue to slow the spread of COVID-19, individuals are required to wear face coverings over their nose and mouth when they are inside buildings and facilities on campus.

Faculty and staff employees are required to wear a well-fitting medical grade mask, surgical mask or higher-level respirator (such as KN95) when indoors, according to the [Jan. 7 health order from LA County Public Health](#). **Students are also recommended to wear an upgraded face covering.**

While face coverings are not required outdoors, it is a best practice to wear one when attending crowded events, such as live performances, parades, fairs, festivals, sports events, or other similar settings where physical distancing cannot be maintained.

Face shields alone are not a replacement for wearing face coverings/masks.

### **Reporting Requirements for Residential Students**

If you receive a positive COVID-19 test, please take the following actions:

- Self-isolate immediately.
- Report your positive test via the [online health screener](#). A member of the Safer Return Incident Investigation Team will follow up with you.
- Inform your residential advisor or community advisor.
- You can seek medical care at Student Health Services or your primary health care provider. Please call-in advance before going to the facility.

### **Isolation and Quarantine**

Cal Poly Pomona is required to follow isolation and quarantine procedures required by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.

Please note the following:

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 and/or a health care provider thinks you have COVID-19:** Regardless of vaccination status, previous infection or lack of symptoms, Los Angeles County Department of Public Health requires that you isolate.
- If you are a **close contact to someone who has COVID-19**, you must follow the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health quarantine requirements.
- Do not come to campus until you have been cleared by the Safer Return Incident Investigation Team.**

For students living on campus who must isolate or quarantine, the Safer Return Incident Investigation Team will make necessary accommodations including moving students into campus isolation and quarantine facilities.
