NON-REPORTING

Reporting is your choice. You are strongly encouraged to contact OEC when you are a survivor of sexual assault, dating/domestic violence, and/or stalking. However, if you choose not to report, there are resources on campus that are still available to you. You may inquire about available resources and accommodations through the OEC or Survivor Advocacy Services (SAS). Accommodations include, but are not limited to, academic and on-campus living arrangements, confidential consultation, and information on reporting options. Please note that staff and faculty with limited expectations, are not confidential resources, and are required to report disclosures of sexual misconduct, dating/domestic violence, and stalking to OEC. Please know there is no deadline to report an incident and it is never too late to report.
