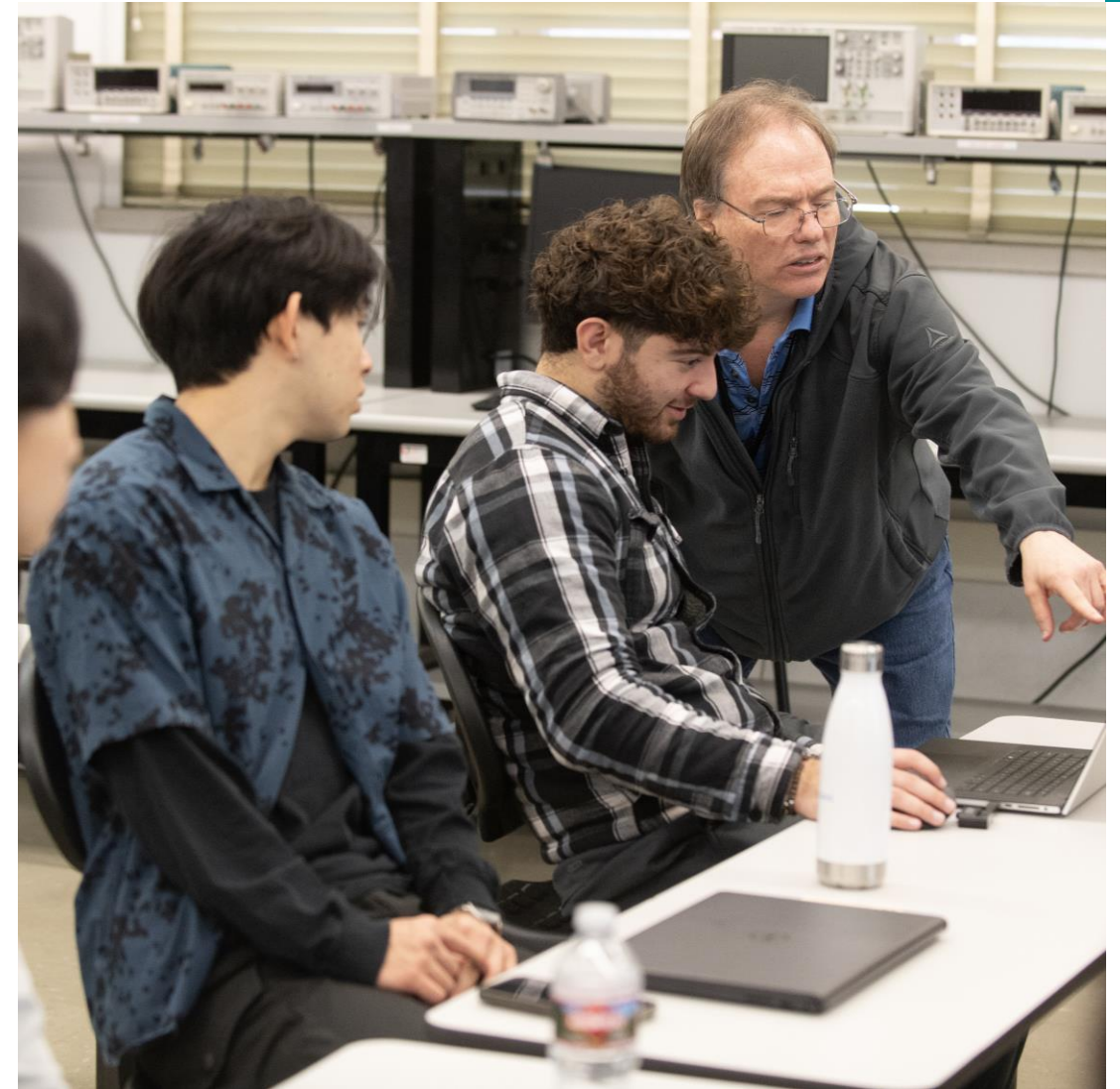
Academic Advising at CPP

Loans: Money that you borrow and must repay.

Subsidized loans do not accrue interest until after you graduate or drop below half-time; unsubsidized loans start accruing interest at the time of disbursement. No Direct Student Loan requires repayment until you either drop below half-time enrollment or graduate and your grace period has expired.

Gift Aid:

Free money that you don't have to pay back. If they are offered to you, the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships will accept them on your behalf.

Eligibility determined by completion of financial aid application.

Federal-Work Study:

- Money that student earns
- Work Study funds are earned based on hours worked and rate of pay
- Use the Career Center to apply for positions.



Understanding Federal Direct Loans

Direct Subsidized Loans 6.39%

- Offered to undergraduate students
- No interest accumulates while enrolled at LEAST half-time
- Payment begins 6-months after graduation or dropping below half-time enrollment.

Direct Unsubsidized Loans 6.39%

- Offered to undergraduate, graduate, and professional students
- Interest accumulates from the time the loan is released.
- Payment begins 6-months after graduation or dropping below half-time.

Direct Parent PLUS Loans 8.94%

- Applied for by parent(s) of dependent undergraduate student; required credit check of parent(s)
- Interest accumulates from the time the loan is released
- Payment begins immediately after the loan's fully released, but deferment is an option

Direct Cost:

DIRECT COST: charges that are billed by Cal Poly Pomona, such as tuition and fees

Directs costs can include food & housing if the student lives on-campus

Indirect Cost:

INDIRECT COSTS: are estimates for additional educational expenses you might have while attending school. Student is not billed by Cal Poly Pomona for indirect costs.

How To Support Your Student

- Consider Options Before Dropping or Withdrawing
- Be Mindful of the Balance Due
 - Calculate Your Costs Ahead of Time
 - Work with SACS
 - Know Financial Aid Eligibility
- Apply Every Year
 - Apply On-Time and Correctly to Avoid/Identify Errors Early On



FERPA:

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

Under FERPA, student's education records can only be released to individuals outside of the university with the student's explicit consent. This includes providing student information to parents.





SAP: Satisfactory Academic Progress

SAP is reviewed each semester to confirm eligibility. Students receive an email letting them know the results and their impacts

Consider Options
