


The Huntley College of Agriculture offers a STEM-based curriculum with handson learning in the food, fashion and farming industries. We are the only:

Students work and learn on nearly 500 acres of pasture, farmland, orchards and vineyards on campus, growing grapes for wine and produce sold in the Cal Poly Pomona Farm Store.

Animal and veterinary science students work with Arabian horses, pigs, sheep and cattle on campus.

Turf, irrigation, and landscaping plant science students have worked at the World Series, Rose Bowl, Dodger Stadium, Angels Stadium, Disneyland, and the Super Bowl. They regularly place top 10 in the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America's Collegiate Turf Bowl competition.
