The only student-designed and student-built entry in the world-famous Tournament of Roses Parade, the Cal Poly Rose Float showcases the talent and skill of Cal Poly students.

For 75 years, teams from Cal Poly Pomona (CPP) and Cal Poly San Luis Obispo (SLO) have worked together to create award-winning floats. The first, in 1949, featured a giant rocking horse and won the Award of Merit. More than 60 awards have followed, and the team has earned a reputation for innovation. The 2024 float, an underwater rock 'n' roll party of giant manta rays and electric eels, will be 55 feet long, 16 feet wide and 23 feet tall.

Building fantastic floats while being separated by 200 miles takes coordination, communication and commitment. Students learn to implement a wide range of skills, such as project management, problem-solving on the fly and adapting to unexpected challenges. The experience epitomizes the learn-by-doing ethos of the Cal Poly campuses, providing an incredible and unique career-readiness program for students of all backgrounds and majors.

INNOVATION BEYOND TROPHIES

In 2024, student designers will introduce a **NEW ANIMATION SYSTEM** for the 75th anniversary float. Over the decades, students have inaugurated several innovations in design, mechanical systems and animation to the Rose Parade. We were the first to use:

- HYDRAULICS FOR ANIMATION (1968)
- COMPUTER-CONTROLLED ANIMATION (1978)
- FIBER OPTICS (1998)
