Timely Warning Crime Bulletin

Attempted Non-Negligent Manslaughter, Aggravated Assault, and Domestic Violence

This timely warning crime bulletin is being issued on 05/05/2021 in compliance with the "Timely Notice" provisions of the Jeanne Clery Act of 1988, and the purpose is to provide preventative information to the campus to aid members from becoming the victim of a similar crime.

The Crime

On 05/04/2021, at approximately 6:02pm, a female victim was involved in a physical altercation with a male subject, in the G parking lot on campus (3801 W Temple Ave, Pomona, CA 91768). As a result of the altercation, the victim sustained major injuries and is currently hospitalized in critical condition. The suspect fled the location in a dark colored vehicle and his whereabouts are currently unknown. The University Police Department (UPD) is investigating this crime as an isolated incident of domestic violence. It is believed that the suspect is known to the victim.

Person of Interest

Geason, Robert Gerrod II, a 27-year-old black male adult, shaved or short hair, beard (see photo), wearing dark-colored clothing.

Vehicle: Black 2019 Nissan Altima 4 Door, CA License Plate 8SBX813. (See photo)

If you know the person of interest, believe you have seen him, or know his location, please call 911 or 909-869-3070 if on campus. Do not attempt to contact or detain the person of interest.

How to Stay Safe

- If possible, when walking or outdoors at night, walk with a friend or in groups, or request a UPD escort at (909) 869-3070.
- Stay in well-lit, populated areas as much as possible.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Avoid distractions such as texting, talking on cell phones, wearing headphones, etc.
- Trust your instincts. If something doesn't feel right, remove yourself from the situation.
