Director's Message

The College Reading Skills Program (CRSP) had a busy and successful winter quarter. I attribute much of that success to the program's dedicated staff, particularly the peer tutors/mentors. While the CRSP tutors are wonderful, they have had an exceptionally impressive quarter. The tutors have a sense of ownership of the program and support the program in several ways beyond tutoring. The tutors conducted most of the many presentations offered to English instructors at beginning of the quarter, which resulted in many new program participants. Each quarter, a few tutors collaborate to prepare the materials and the plan of action for the peer mentor sessions. This quarter's two peer mentoring topics were Summer Opportunities and Health and Wellness Centers. Recently, a couple of tutors took the initiative to research graduate entrance exam materials that would better suit our students. CRSP tutors had 100% attendance at the LRC's one-hour training on brain-based learning and CRSP's Tutor Skills Development meeting.

In late January, the LRC hosted an open house and CRSP tutors were available to greet guests and answer questions. When asked if they could help cover tutoring sessions because a fellow tutor called out sick, they respond. They are supportive of one another and the program and work as a true team. As indicated on the tutor recognition forms available for tutees to nominate their tutors for an award, the tutors work hard and the students are grateful for their dedication. I, too, am grateful for their dedication. College Reading Skills Program tutors truly step up to the plate.

"I AM...A BURRO...GENIUS! MIRACLEMAKER! I KICK ASS!" Winter Book Club began with a short viewing of Victor Villaseñor's recent lecture at Cal Poly Pomona this past November in order to give face and voice to the prolific Mexican-American author's memoir, *Burro Genius*. Members spent the first meeting discussing their impressions of the author at the event, which was sponsored by several organizations on campus, including the

Spanish Language Association, the EFL department, and the library, to name just a few. During subsequent meetings we discussed Villaseñor's memories of growing up Mexican in a school system that degraded non-white students and where his growth as both a student and a writer was often stunted by instances of institutionalized racism. We look forward to next quarter's reading selection: Marching Powder: A True Story of Friendship, Cocaine, and South America's Strangest Jail. Meetings are tentatively scheduled for Thursdays during U-Hour of weeks 3, 5, and 7. 
