Welcome to Cal Poly Pomona and the CSU's Fully Online Courses Program

Now that you are enrolled in a CSU Fully Online course at Cal Poly Pomona, we would like to

give you some guidance, advice, and resources to help you complete your online course.

You are a student at Cal Poly Pomona (CPP) and with your CPP "Bronco" Student ID number, you can explore and have access to a wealth of online resources

Your student portal and gateway to campus online services is MyCPP. You will find it by clicking the link MyCPP. You must have your Bronco Number before you can access MyCPP. A request to drop a class cannot be submitted once your home or host campus enrollment period has ended. If you wish to drop your Fully Online course, once

you have successfully enrolled, please visit <u>CSU Fully Online</u> for instructions and frequently asked questions.

After completing the course, the grade will be automatically transferred to your home CSU campus and posted as transfer credit. As a student at CPP, you will need transcripts from us for any future academic endeavors (transfer or graduate school). In addition, the online class will compute your Academic Standing at CPP. If you receive a failing grade (D, F, or W) in this class, it may negatively impact your academic standing, even if you remain in good standing at your home campus. This status will become part of your permanent academic record.

Here are a few facts to know about your host campus, Cal Poly Pomona:

- 1. The **online course delivery at Cal Poly Pomona** may be different compared to your home campus. Click the link to review the Online Course Instruction Modes.
- Our courses are supported by a NEW technology platform called Canvas. More information will be available to you approaching the start of the Fall 2024 semester.
- 3. You have access to all our University Library resources, and you can explore our online library services at University Library.
- 4. Our bookstore can provide the course materials you need for your class. Most materials are provided automatically via their Instant/Flexible Access complete program and the cost is automatically charged to your CPP student account. Depending on how many CPP courses you are taking, you may want to change from the flat fee "Complete" program to the "Flexible" program that charges only for your specific materials.
