Important Enrollment Information

Last day to drop class without record	September 3, 2026
Last day to withdraw from classes online and receive a "W" grade	September 16, 2026
Last day of classes for all students	December 6, 2026
Final Exams Week	December 7 – December 13, 2026

A request to drop a class cannot be submitted once your home or host campus enrollment period has ended. Should you wish to drop your Fully Online course, after you have been successfully enrolled, please visit [CSU Fully Online](#) for instructions and frequently asked questions.

After completing the course, the grade will be automatically transferred to your home CSU campus and posted as transfer credit. As a CPP student, you will need to request transcripts from us for any future academic endeavors (transfer or graduate school). In addition, the online class will impact your Academic Standing at CPP. If you receive a failing grade, it may negatively impact your academic standing and/or Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP), even if you remain in good standing at your home campus. This status will become part of your permanent academic record. Refer to your home campus's grading policies for additional information. Most materials are provided automatically via their Instant/Flexible Access complete program and the cost is automatically charged to your CPP student account. Depending on how many CPP courses you are taking, you may want to change from the flat fee “Complete” program to the “Flexible” program that charges only for your specific materials.
