Describe the assessment item: Question 1 on the pre-post assessment for the unit on weather and seasons: Draw a picture and add words to describe the weather pattern in Pomona in September. Be ready to talk about these questions: How do you know this? What is your evidence?

Interview questions: (1) What kinds of weather did you draw? (2) How do you know what the weather is like? (3) Does [something missing from the drawing] have anything to do with weather? (4) Is weather always the same or does it change? (4) Is weather the same everywhere?

Describe the ideal response: The picture should show that the weather in Pomona in September is mostly sunny and warm or hot. The drawing shouldn't include any rain. The interview questions reveal the following responses: A weather pattern describes what weather is like most of the time. In September, the weather pattern in Pomona is mostly sunny and warm or hot. But the weather pattern changes from month to month. For example, in January, it's mostly cool or warm, and it's rainier than in September. Weather patterns in Pomona change during the day, too. It's usually cooler in the morning and warmer in the afternoon. Weather patterns aren't the same everywhere. For example, Detroit, Michigan, has much colder and snowier weather in January than Pomona does. We know about Pomona's weather because we can feel it and see it. We can measure it too. For example, we can use a thermometer to measure how hot or cold it is in Pomona. We can tell the weather changes over time by looking at our calendars and making graphs that show the weather each day and how it changes. We can see patterns in our graphs, like the pattern that shows it's hotter in September than it is in January.
