The Mathematics and Statistics Department in the College of Science at California State Polytechnic University, Pomona (Cal Poly Pomona) invites applications to become a member of our lecturer pool starting **Fall 2025**.

**POSITION DESCRIPTION:** As a member of the Department of Mathematics and Statistics Lecturer Pool, you will become eligible and considered (depending upon your qualifications and availability) to teach mathematics or statistics courses at Cal Poly Pomona. However, please note that membership in the Lecturer Pool does not guarantee that you will be assigned classes to teach.

We have a student body with diverse socio-economic and cultural backgrounds and learning styles and are looking for faculty who can work successfully in this environment. Salary will be commensurate with experience and qualifications.

**QUALIFICATIONS:** You are required to have a masters or doctoral degree in mathematics, statistics or a closely related field. Your qualifying degree must be completed by **August 1, 2025**. Evidence demonstrating recent teaching excellence must be provided in your application. Preference will be given to applicants who are professionally engaged in mathematical, statistical or math/stat educational activities and to those able to demonstrate the capability to increase student interest and achievement in mathematics and statistics.

**HOW TO APPLY:** To be considered for the position, you should email: application form, cover letter, curriculum vitae, copies of undergraduate and graduate transcripts and a minimum of three recent letters of reference (original transcript, original reference letters, and an application form are required of finalists).
